


The Luminous Mysteries (cont.)

The fourth Luminous mystery- The Transfiguration Jesus answered them, "My teaching is not mine, but His who sent Me; if any man's will is to do His will, he shall know whether the teaching is from God or whether I am speaking on my own authority." - John 7: 16-17

The fifth Luminous mystery- The Establishment of the Eucharist Jesus said to the crowds, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to Me will never hunger, and whoever believes in Me will never thirst. But I told you that although you have seen Me, you do not believe. Everything that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and I will not reject anyone who comes to Me because I came down from heaven not to do my own will but the will of the one who sent me, but that I should raise it on the last day. For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in Him may have eternal life, and I shall raise him on the last day." - John 6: 35-40

The Joyful Mysteries

The first Joyful mystery- The Annunciation "Behold, the Handmaid of the Lord, be it done unto me according to Thy Word."- Luke 1:38

The second Joyful mystery- The Visitation "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the Will of God in Christ Jesus for you." - 1 Thessalonians 5:18

The third Joyful mystery- The Birth of Jesus "My food is to do the will of him who sent me, and to accomplish His work."- John 4:34

The fourth Joyful mystery- The Presentation "Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is."- Ephesians 5:17

The fifth Joyful mystery- The Finding of the Child Jesus in the Temple "For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you abstain from immorality." - 1 Thessalonians 4:3

The Sorrowful Mysteries

The first Sorrowful mystery- The Agony in the Garden "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as Thou wilt."- Matthew 26:39

The second Sorrowful mystery- The Scourging at the Pillar "Since therefore Christ suffered in the flesh, arm yourselves with the same thought, for whoever has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin, so as to live for the rest of the time in the flesh no longer by human passions but by the will of God."- 1 Peter 4: 1-2

The third Sorrowful mystery- The Crowning with Thorns "I do as the Father has commanded Me, so that the world may know that I love the Father."- John 14:31

The Sorrowful Mysteries (cont.)

The fourth Sorrowful mystery- The Carrying of the Cross "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed, by the renewal of your mind, that you may prove what is the will of God, what is good, and acceptable, and perfect."- Romans 12: 1-2

The fifth Sorrowful mystery- The Crucifixion Jesus said, "When you have lifted up the Son of man, then you will know that I am he and that I do nothing on my own authority but speak thus as the Father has taught. As he who sent me is with me, he has not left me alone, for I always do what is pleasing to Him."- John 8- 28-29

The Glorious Mysteries

The first Glorious mystery- The Resurrection "Now may the God of peace who brought again from the dead Our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, equip you with everything good that you may do His will, working in you that which is pleasing in His sight, through Jesus Christ; to whom be the glory forever and ever. Amen."- Hebrews 13:20-21

The second Glorious mystery- The Ascension "Not everyone who says to Me, Lord, Lord, will enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of my Father in heaven."- Matthew 7:21

The Glorious Mysteries (cont.)

The third Glorious mystery- The Descent of the Holy Spirit. "And so from the day we heard of it, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of His will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, to lead a life worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to Him bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God."- Colossians 1: 9-10

The fourth Glorious mystery- The Assumption "And blessed is She who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to Her from the Lord." - Luke 1:45

The fifth Glorious mystery- The Coronation "Whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother." - Matthew 12:50

The Luminous Mysteries

The first Luminous mystery- The Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan "And this is the confidence which we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His Will, he hears us."- 1 John 5:14

The second Luminous mystery- The Wedding Feast at Cana "And the world passes away, and the lust of it; but he who does the Will of God abides forever." - 1 John 2:17

The third Luminous mystery- The Proclamation of the Gospel and Call to Conversion "What do you think? A man has two sons; and he went to the first and said, 'son go and work in the vineyard today. And he answered, 'I will not'; but after he repented and went. And he went to the second son and said the same; and he answered, 'I go, sir,' but did not go. Which of the two did the will of the father? They said, "The first." Jesus said to them, "Truly I say to you , the tax collectors and the harlots go into the kingdom of God before you."- Matthew 21: 28-31
